Pre-K Potty Policy

It is the goal of Unity Christian School Pre-K to have the best interest of every student. It is for this reason that the following guidelines have been set forth.

All UCS Pre-K campers **MUST** be potty trained **PRIOR** to the beginning of summer camp, this includes during naptime. If a student has 2 accidents while awake or 4 while sleeping within four weeks, then we will assume they are not “potty trained” or there may be an underlying issue.

If a student has accidents within a 4 week time span as stated above, one of the following will occur:

1. That student will be placed on an “in school probation” period of 2 weeks. If a student has any accidents within the 2 week probation period, we reserve the right to suspend attendance of that student until there is resolution. This timeframe hopefully will give all caregivers time to evaluate the student’s potty behaviors to assure there is no medical concern and/or other behaviors that may be affecting the child.
OR
2. Parents must provide a documented medical evaluation to determine if there is a medical reason that is causing potty concerns. If this is the case, each incident will be investigated and a need for probation will be determined by the Summer Camp Director and/or Teacher.
3. In either of the above cases (1 or 2), discussions with the caregivers will be conducted to ensure the best decision is made for the benefit of all parties involved.

A toilet trained child is a child who can do the following:

- Communicate to staff that they need to go to the restroom before they need to go
- Alert themselves to stop what they are doing, to go and use the restroom
- Pull down their clothes and pull them back up without assistance
- Complete toileting activities independently, including wiping (*minimal assistance needed*)
- Get on and off toilet by self
- Wash and dry hands
- Wake up during nap time should they need to use the restroom
- Postpone going if they must wait for other students who are in the restroom or if class is away from the restroom

We realize that there are a number of reasons for delays in being fully “potty-trained”. Due to the nature of our program, and the structure of our facilities, we are not equipped to handle consistent accidents. Please understand that this policy is not in place to shame or punish the student or inconvenience primary caregivers. Cleaning up after accidents have occurred in a preschool setting is time consuming and may take time away from the direct supervision of other students. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter and look forward to a rewarding and successful summer camp.
